Course Guide 2024/25

What level should I study?

This is a general guide of our entry requirements. Some courses, such as A Levels, have specific requirements; these are available on our website.

Detailed course information, including an overview of the topics you will study and the skills that you will learn can also be found on our website.

Entry Level

You will need: An initial assessment in English and Maths.

What's next? Level 1 course.

Level 1

You will need: GCSEs at grade 2 or above, or an entry level qualification (including Entry Level 3 Functional Skills in English and Maths).

What's next? Level 2 course.

Level 2

You will need: Four GCSEs at grade 3 or above or a Level 1 qualification (with a suitable level of English and Maths functional skills).

What's next? Level 3 course.

Level 3

A Levels

You will need: Five GCSEs at grade 5 or above which must include English Language and Maths at grade 5.

Level 3 Extended Diplomas

You will need: 4 GCSEs at grade 4 or above including English and Maths at grade 4.

T Levels

You will need: 5 GCSEs at grade 4 or above including English and Maths at grade 4.

Please note that:

- IT related T Levels require a grade 6 or above in Maths.
- Accounting related T Levels require a grade 5 or above in Maths.

A Levels

Our A Level programme is academically challenging. Students take a combination of three or four courses depending on your grades. Graduates from our A Level programme progress to universities including Russell Group and Oxbridge.

Level 3 Extended Certificates

These courses are equivalent to one A Level and are taken as part of an A Level programme.

Level 3 Extended Diplomas

A vocational programme lasting two years where you develop specialist knowledge and practical skills within a vocational area. These courses will give you a qualification that is the equivalent to three A Levels. Graduates from our Level 3 Extended Diploma programmes progress to either universities, degree apprenticeships or employment.

T Levels

T Levels are new two-year technical study programmes equivalent to three A Levels. They are delivered in a classroom environment with 20% of the time spent working on an industry placement in an employer setting. We also offer T Level Foundation year programmes designed to develop the skills and experience needed to progress onto a T Level.

Intensive GCSEs (Progress to Advanced)

Our intensive GCSE programme is aimed at helping students who have studied overseas to get the qualifications they need to progress.

Foundation Learning

We offer Level 1 and Entry Level courses for students who are working below grade 3 or have mild to moderate learning difficulties.

These courses have no formal entry requirements and teach skills for independent living, IT, numeracy, literacy and employability and allow you to progress to a Level 1 or Level 2 course.
